Bangkok, 02 March, 2020 – The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) would like to provide an infographic on the Thai tourism industry's measures to prevent Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). The information includes procedures upon arrival at the point of entry, on business and on tour.

Tips for Conducting Tourism Business in Thailand

Tourism Authority of Thailand's travel recommendations regarding Thailand's COVID-19 control measures.

Upon arrival at the point of entry

- Travellers are subject to primary fever screening by thermo scanners or infrared thermometers and questionnaire on past travel history and contact information.
- Travellers with no fever will receive a health beware card and be allowed to enter the country.
- Travellers with a body temperature above 37.5 degrees Celsius and has COVID-19 symptoms will be isolated and transferred to a designated hospital for quarantine or treatment.
- Travellers who have been in close contact with suspected cases will be followed up for 14 days upon transmission control standards.

On Business

- Participants are subject to primary fever screening by infrared thermometers at the venue's entrance. Any participants show sign of COVID-19 symptoms are subject to further medical evaluation and treatment.
- Participants have to wear a badge or sticker showing that they have passed the primary screening.
- Masks will be provided for participants upon request.
- Hand sanitizer will be provided in the event area.
- The venue is to undergo disinfection before the event.

On Tour (familiarization Trip)

- Participants are subject to primary fever screening by infrared thermometers. Any participants show sign of COVID-19 symptoms are subject to further medical evaluation and treatment.
- While personal travelling to crowded places, wearing mask and avoid close contact is recommended.
- The vehicle is to undergo disinfection before use.
